


- The 2018 Annual meeting was a success on multiple fronts, the Association is looking at a significant profit as well as starting to establish itself among other international associations.

- Looking for chapters to volunteer locations for future annual meetings. Ideally, should have meetings planned 5 years out, only have the next 3. The shorter the timeline the more difficult to get good weeks, hotels and negotiate pricing/concessions.
- Would like to see a larger influence of environmental symposia at future Annual Meetings
- Continue to encourage chapters and active members to host conferences and technical symposia locally and regionally to help bolster chapter funds and provide recognition for the Association

- All chapter officers should be receiving updates and call in information related to the Chapter Support

- Concern the chapters are feeling distant and not represented at the association level. Need ideas to connect local chapter leadership to one another and to association leadership.
- Texas Sunset Commission licensure threat, risk to all Texas geology license's, Received \$20,000 from the AEG licensure fund to help battle to keep geology licensure in Texas.
- Licensure in Idaho is also under review, many geologists in the state and in nearby states already organized and battling to keep licensure.
- The AEG South Africa chapter was dissolved and integrated with SAIAEG (there are now no official AEG chapters outside the US)
- BOD voted to implement the strategic plan, a living document crafted to prioritize the memberships stated goals.
- Questions to consider for the MYBM: What are AEGs international objectives? How can AEG better serve the US membership? What are the organizations goals?
- AEG is working with other geological and environmental organizations (GSA, GeoCoalition, Canadian Geotechnical Society (CGS), American Geosciences Consortium at NCSL and American Geological Institute (AGI))
- E.Gath was elected and the international representative of AEG at the international meeting.
- The code of conduct was approved by the membership in the last election
- Funding increased for RD travel to the MYBM to \$1000 per RD and to \$750 per RD for Annual Meeting travel.



Funds are about \$200 down from last quarter


Major quarterly income was from the March field trip/meeting and the April Meeting.




