Jane Campbell, Senior Director of Resource Planning, will provide a brief overview of Santee Cooper, South Carolina's stateowned electric and water utility, and then explain the resource planning process. She will discuss Santee Cooper's most recently approved resource plan, and the challenges they face going forward. She will also discuss solar energy – the pros and cons, and Santee Cooper's plans to bring more solar energy to South Carolina.

As the Senior Director of Resource Planning for Santee Cooper, Jane manages resource planning, including development of the utility's 2023 Integrated Resource Plan, and renewable energy contracts. Prior to Joining Santee Cooper, Jane spent 20 years at BP/Amoco, serving in various roles at the Cooper River Chemical plant in Mt. Pleasant, SC. In 2006, Jane joined Santee Cooper, and has served in various roles including Generation, Fuel Strategy and Supply, and Environmental and Water Systems. She assumed her current role in 2022.

Jane is a native of Greenville, SC. She received a Bachelor of Science in Mechanical Engineering from Clemson University and has a Master's in Business Administration from The Citadel. She is a licensed Professional Engineer in the state of South Carolina.

She lives in Moncks Corner with her husband Jim, and she has twin daughters who are recent graduates of Clemson University and Appalachian State University. Jane has served Trident United Way on the Women's Leadership Council Steering Committee and the Program Investment Review Council, and on the Clemson University Restoration Institute Executive Advisory Board. She currently serves on the Board of Directors for the Governors' School for Science and Mathematics Foundation and is an Elder and Clerk of Session at the Moncks Corner First Presbyterian Church.
