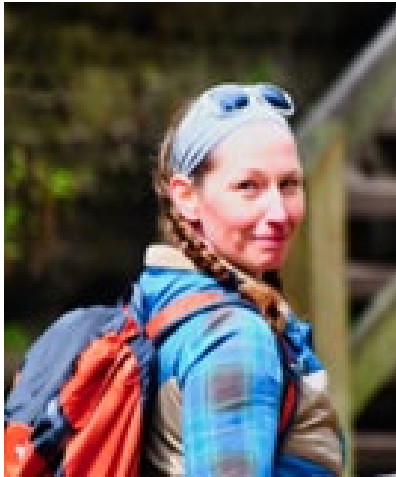


Special Edition: Summer Chapter Meeting at the Beach!
